<b>UB Freshman Seminar</b>	9 <sup>th</sup> grade elective course taught at PHS by UB counselors.	Daily during the school day as part of your high school schedule.	<b>Required for all 9<sup>th</sup> graders.</b>
<b>UB Senior Seminar</b>	12 <sup>th</sup> grade elective course taught at PHS by UB counselors. The second semester (0.5 credit) is a dual-credit course (HS GPA weighted) that provides 1 college credit for WVU 191: First Year Seminar, a required college freshman course at WVU.	Daily during the school day as part of your high school schedule.	<b>Required for all 12<sup>th</sup> graders.</b>
<b>Advisory/LINKS</b>	9 <sup>th</sup> /10 <sup>th</sup> and 11 <sup>th</sup> /12 <sup>th</sup> grade Advisory/LINKS periods taught at PHS by UB counselors.	Daily during the school day as part of your high school schedule.	<b>Required for all UB participants.</b>
<b>After-School Sessions</b>	Whole group sessions provided after school at PHS.	Sessions are provided weekly with a monthly schedule.	<b>Participants are required to attend 2 sessions per month. Stipends may be earned for participation.</b>
<b>Tutoring &amp; Test Prep</b>	Integrated into UB courses and after school sessions with supplemental sessions offered by appointment. Additional test prep or tutoring programs (Testive, MasteryPrep, etc.) may be offered if available.	Sessions are integrated into UB courses, advisory, and after school sessions. Supplemental sessions are offered by appointment.	<b>Supplemental sessions are encouraged, but not required unless specified in Program Standing Contract.</b>
<b>Saturday Programs</b>	Social, cultural, and educational programs offered at WVU or other locations (college visits, museums, etc.). Transportation provided for most programs from PHS.	Offered 2-3 times per semester (4-6 total).	<b>Encouraged, but not required unless specified in Program Standing Contract. Stipends may be earned for participation.</b>
<b>Individual Success Plan (ISP) Meetings</b>	Individual meeting with UB counselor to discuss progress, goals, and needs.	At least once per semester.	<b>Required for all UB participants. Scheduled by UB counselors.</b>

### Summer Program Summary

<b>Rising Senior Academy</b>	College preparation bootcamp focused on college admissions process and senior year of high school.	Residential on WVU's campus for 3 weeks (usually end of June to mid-July).	<b>Required for rising seniors (just completed 11<sup>th</sup> grade). Up to \$45 stipend earned for full participation.</b>
<b>Summer Experience</b>	Designed to simulate a college-going experience for younger participants. Hands-on, daily instruction in core academic courses (math, science, English, foreign language). Social, cultural, and residential experiences are incorporated daily.	Residential on WVU's campus for 3 weeks (usually end of June to mid-July).	<b>Required for new participants (first summer after program entry). Open to all participants who are not rising seniors. Up to \$45 stipend earned for full participation.</b>
<b>Rising Senior Early Start</b>	First 3 weeks run concurrently with Rising Senior Academy. Participants enroll in a WVU college course for credit, usually the first course in their math placement sequence. Tutoring and academic support services are provided. Students participate in a work-study research experience facilitated by WVU faculty and graduate assistant mentors. Students completing the Rising Senior Early Start, Summer Bridge, and UB Senior Seminar will enter college with 7 college credits earned through UB.	Residential on WVU's campus for 6 weeks (usually end of June to first week of August)	<b>Encouraged for rising seniors, but not required. Rising juniors with strong academic profiles may also be considered for the program. Up to \$270 stipend earned for full participation.</b>
<b>Summer Bridge</b>	Participants enroll in WVU college course for credit. If they completed the Rising Senior Early Start program, then students will continue with their math sequence or complete English 101 or another general education requirement. Tutoring and academic support services are provided. Students participate in a work-study research experience facilitated by WVU faculty and graduate assistant mentors. Students participate in a non-credit college transition course and college counseling.	Residential on WVU's campus for 6 weeks (usually end of June to first week of August)	<b>Encouraged for rising college freshmen (especially those attending WVU), but not required. Up to \$270 stipend earned for full participation.</b>
